## ASSIGNMENT

Hunt died seized and possessed or which has been acquired by the Executrix and/or Trustee of his Estate, that I may now own or hereafter become vested with or entitled to under or by virtue of any of the terms, provisions, conditions and trusts contained in the last will and testament of the said T. F. Hunt, deceased, dated February 27, 1922, on file in the Office of the Probate Court for Greenville County, South Carolina, in Apartment 262, File 18, as interpreted by the Court and filed in the Office of the Clerk of Court for Greenville County on January 23, 1950, in Judgment Roll F-59.

And I hereby covenant and agree that I will hold in trust any and all sums of money and property that shall be paid to me as my share of the income from said estate in trust and pay the same over to The Peoples National Bank of Greenville, S. C., or its successors and assigns in payment of the aforesaid note.

I hereby represent:

- (1) That I am more than twenty-one years of age.
- (2) That I have not heretofore sold, assigned, transferred, mortgaged or in any way encumbered my interest in the Estate of the said T. F. Hunt, deceased, or any part thereof, except:

An undivided one-sixth (1/6) interest of my one-fourth (1/4) interest in said property heretofore conveyed by me to Alfred F. Burgess by deed dated February 1, 1950, not yet recorded, and assignment of one-sixth (1/6) of my interest in the income and property of said T. F. Hunt, deceased, assigned to the said Alfred F. Burgess by assignment dated January 31, 1950.
