MORTGAGE OF REAL ESTATE COUNTY OF Greenville To All Whom These Presents May Concern: I. Wesley C. Page, of Greenville County, SEND GREETINGS: WHEREAS, I the said Wesley C. Page in and by my certain promissory note, in writing, of even date with these presents am well and truly indebted to FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATION OF GREENVILLE, in the full and just sum of One Thousand and No/100 - - - - - - - (\$ 1,000.00) Dollars, with interest at the rate of six (6%) per centum per annum, to be repaid in installments of Fifteen and No/100 - - - - - - - - - - - - - - (\$ 15.00) Dollars upon the first day of each and every calendar month hereafter in advance, until the full principal sum, with interest has been paid, said monthly payments shall be applied first to the payment of interest, computed monthly on the unpaid balance, and then to the payment of principal; said note further providing that if at any time any portion of the principal or interest due thereunder shall be past due and unpaid for a period of thirty (30) days, or failure to comply with any of the By-Laws of said Association, or any of the stipulations of this mortgage, the whole amount due under said note, shall, at the option of the holder thereof, become immediately due and payable, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage; said note further providing for ten (10%) per centum attorney's fee beside all costs and expenses of collection, to be added to the amount due on said note, and to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part thereof, be collected by an attorney, or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage); as in and by said note, reference being thereunto had, will more fully appear. in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATION OF GREENVILLE, ac-

cording to the terms of said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars to me, Wesley C. Page

in hand well and truly paid by the said FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATION OF GREENVILLE, at and before the signing of these presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATION OF GREENVILLE, the following described property, to-wit:

"All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or to be constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, in Oaklawn Township on Highway No. 29 on or near Saluda River and near P. & N. Railroad, said tract containing 11.4 acres, more or less, and being more fully described according to a plat by J. Coke Smith & Son, Surveyors, dated May 15, 1952, as follows, to-wit:

"BEGINNING at a point in center of S. C. Highway No. 29 leading from Pelzer to Greenville and running thence along line of J. P. Adams, S. 38-30 E. 266 feet to an iron pin; thence N. 74-00 E. 245 feet to a point in center of P. & N. Railroad tracks; thence S. 2-30 E. 257.4 feet to a point in center of Saluda River; thence up Saluda River, 1,625 feet to a point in center of bridge; thence along center of Highway No. 29 in the direction of Greenville, 638 feet to a point; thence leaving highway and running along line of property now or formerly owned by Ben M. Page, S. 49-15 E. 112 feet to an iron pin; thence N. 64-35 E. 488 feet to an iron pin; thence N. 33-27 W. 212 feet to a point in center of Highway No. 29; thence along center of said highway 435 feet to the beginning corner, including the plumbing, electrical and heating fixtures now located on said premises, or to be installed thereon, which are hereby expressly agreed to be a part of the realty. Being the same conveyed to me by Emma Page Mullinax by deed dated May 17, 1952 and recorded in the R. M. C. office for Greenville County in Vol. 456, at page 255."
