WHEREAS, the Mortgagor is well and truly indebted unto FIDELITY FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATION, GREENVILLE, S. C., (hereinafter referred to as Mortgagee) as evidenced by the Mortgagor's promissory note of even date herewith, the terms of which are incorporated herein by reference in the sum of Five Hundred and No/100----

WHEREAS, the Mortgagor may hereafter become indebted to the said Mortgagee for such further sums as may be advanced to or for the Mortgagor's account for taxes, insurance premiums, public assessments, repairs, or for any other purpose:

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That the Mortgagor, in consideration of the aforesaid debt, and in order to secure the payment thereof and of any other and further sums for which the Mortgagor may be indebted to the Mortgagee at any time for advances made to or for his account by the Mortgagee, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars (\$3.00) to the Mortgagor in hand well and truly paid by the Mortgagee at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto the Mortgagee, its successors and assigns.

"All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or hereafter constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, in Greenville Township, on the South side of Emile Avenue, being known and designated as lot #7, of the property of the American Bank and Trust Company, as shown on a plat thereof prepared by R. E. Dalton, Engr., September 1924, recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book F at Page 254, and having, "according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

"REGINNING at a pin on the South side of Emile Avenue, said pin being 234.7 feet from the Southwest intersection of Emile Avenue with the new cut road (now known as Bramlett Road) and running thence along the rear lines of lots 1, 2 and 3, S. 49-30 W. 175 feet to a point on the rear line of lot # 3 at the Northeast corner of lot # 6; thence along the line of lot # 6, N. 40-30 W. 75 feet to a pin; thence along the line of lot # 8, N. 49-30 E. 175 feet to a pin on the South side of Emile Avenue; thence along the South side of Emile Avenue, S. 40-30 E. 75 feet to the beginning corner. Being the same premises conveyed to the mortgagors by William Ansel Hammond by deed to be recorded in Volume 354 at Page 427."
