NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That I, the said

aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof, according to the terms of the said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars, to me in hand well and truly paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Fred M. Thompson, his heirs and assigns forever:

All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, Greenville Township, being known and designated as Lots Nos. 17 and 18 and a portion of a 25-foot alley to the south and east thereof of the property of the L. A. Whitmire Estate according to a plat thereof prepared by W. J. Riddle, Surveyor, August, 1949 and recorded in the R.M.C. office for Greenville County in Plat Book Y, at page 87, and having, according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the south side of the right-of-way of U.S. Alternate Route #13, the joint front corner of Lots 18 and 19, and running thence along the joint line of said lots, S. 3-11 E. 200 feet to an iron pin, joint rear corner of said lots; thence S. 3-11 E. 25 feet to a point on the southern edge of a 25-foot alley; thence along the southern edge of said 25-foot alley, N. 86-49 E. 185 feet, more or less, to a point on line of property belonging to H. K. Townes; thence along the line of said property, N. 24-18 E. 250 feet, more or less, to an iron pin on the south side of the right-of-way of U. S. Alternate Route #13; thence along the south side of the right-of-way of U. S. Alternate Route #13, S. 86-49 W. 300 feet to the beginning corner, including the plumbing, electrical and heating fixtures now located on said premises, or to be installed thereon, which are hereby expressly agreed to be a part of the realty. And I do hereby bind myself, my Heirs, Executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said mortgagee, his Heirs whomsoever lawfully claiming, or to claim the same or any part thereof.
