NOW KNOW ALL MEN, That I/we, the said mortgagor(s) in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATION OF GREENVILLE, according to the terms of said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars to me/us the said mortgagor(s) in hand well and truly paid by the said FIRST FEDERAL SAV-of Three Dollars to me/us the said mortgagor(s) in hand well and truly paid by the said FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATION OF GREENVILLE, at and before the signing of these presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATION OF GREENVILLE, the following described property, to-wit:

"All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or to be constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenvilk, in Paris Mountain Township, shown and designated as the eastern half of Lot 3 of the property of D. B. Tripp as shown on plat recorded in Plat Book Y, page 15, and being more particularly described as follows:

"BEGINNING at an iron pin on the Southern side of Sulphur Springs Road, which pin is on the Southern edge of a 7-foot strip reserved for a sidewalk along Sulphur Springs Road, said pin being also the joint corner of Lots 3 and 2, and running thence along the line of Lot 2, S. 0-07 W. 185.3 feet to an iron pin; thence S. 87-15 W. 75 feet to iron pin at corner of other property of James Woodrow Cunningham; thence with line of said property, N. 0-06 W. 184 feet, more or less, to iron pin on Sulphur Springs Road; thence with southern side of Sulphur Springs Road, N. 86-36 E. 75 feet to point of beginning; being the same conveyed to me by James Woodrow Cunningham by deed dated September 9th, 1954 and recorded in the R. M. C. office for Greenville County in Deed Vol. 507, at page 514."
