Payne as will more fully appear by reference to deed recorded in Vol. UU, at page 674 in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County. Three-hundredths of an acre was acquired by V. L. Johnson, Sr., deceased, from Mary Payne Holliday, by deed dated June 30, 1934 and recorded in Vol. 175 at page 487 in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County.
