"All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or hereafter constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, Highland Town-ship, on a farm road leading northward from State Highway No. 414 at the old home place of Dr. T.E. Morrow, near Liberty Methodist Church, containing 45 acres, more or less, and having the following courses and distances, to-wit:
