WHEREAS

WHEREAS, the Mortgagor may hereafter become indebted to the said Mortgagee for such further sums as may be advanced to or for the Mortgagor's account for taxes, insurance premiums, public assessments, repairs, or for any other purposes:

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That the Mortgagor, in consideration of the aforesaid debt, and in order to secure the payment thereof, and of any other and further sums for which the Mortgagor may be indebted to the Mortgagoe at any time for advances made to or for his account by the Mortgagoe, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars (\$3.00) to the Mortgagor in hand well and truly paid by the Mortgagoe at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto the Mortgagoe, its successors and assigns:

"ALL that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or hereafter constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, signating on the Southeast side of the Greenville.

Piedmont Road (also known as \$1.5. Highway 20) near Grove Station, in Grove Township, Greenville County, S. C. containing 2.08 acres more or less and being a portion of the proxecuty shown on plat recorded in the RMC Office for Greenville County, S. C. in Plat Book II, page 183 and having, according to a recent survey made by John C. Smith, Surveyor, December 23, 1957, recorded in the RMC Office for Greenville County, S. C. in Plat Book II, Page 184, the following metes and bounds, to wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the Southeast edge of the Greenville-Piedmont Road and running thence S. 49-54 E. 335 feet to an iron pin on the Northwest edge of the right of way of the Piedmont and Northern Railroad; thence along the Northwest edge of right of way of the Piedmont and Northern Railroad, N. 32-36 E. 333 feet to an iron pin; thence N. 62 W. 150 feet to an iron pin; thence S, 73-30 W thence along the Southeast edge of the Greenville Piedmont Road, S. 56-13 W. 249.6 feet to the beginning corner.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular the said premises unto the Mortgages, its heirs, successors end assigns, forever,

The Mortgagor covenants that it is lawfully seized of the premises hereigabove described in fee apple absolute, that it has good right and la-lawfully authorized to sell, convey or encumber the same, and that the premises are free and clear of all liens and encumbrances except as provided herein. The Mortgagor further covenants to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the Mortgagoe forever, from and against the Mortgagor and all persons whomsoever lawfully claiming the same or any part thereof.
