at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have  
 granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said  
 All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate lying and being near the  
 City of Greenville, County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, being  
 known and designated as Lot No. 9 and the adjoining lot on the rear thereof, as  
 shown on a plat prepared by Pickell and Pickell, Engineers dated April 2, 1947,  
 entitled Property of Sallie Mae Lunsford, recorded in the R. M. C. Office for  
 Greenville County, South Carolina, in Plat Book U at page 123/120 having according  
 to a more recent plat prepared by J. C. Hill, Surveyor dated February 12, 1954,  
 entitled Property of John J. and Dexter R. Davis, the following metes and bounds  
 BEGINNING at an iron pin on the Western side of Hill Street (also known as  
 Alamo Street) at the joint front corner of Lots No. 8 and 9, which iron pin is  
 situate in an unopened 20 foot alley and running thence with the Western side  
 of Hill Street (also known as Alamo Street) N. 10-50 E. 64.5 feet to an iron  
 pin at the joint front corner of Lots Nos. 9 and 10, thence with the line of  
 Lot No. 10 N. 79-31 W. 361.5 feet to an iron pin, thence S. 10-50 W. 64.5 feet  
 to an iron pin, which iron pins situate in an unopened 20 foot alley, thence  
 with said alley S. 79-31 E. 361.5 feet to the point of beginning.
