ALL THAT CERTAIN piece, parcel or tract of land, situate, lying and being on School House Creek on Gap Creek Road, in Cleveland Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, as shown on PROPERTY PLAT REDRAWN, SURVEYED AND COMPILED FOR LELIAN A. MOSELEY, JR., ET AL, by R. K. Campbell, Engineer, dated February, 1959, recorded in the RMC Office of Greenville County, South Carolina in Plat Book "QQ", at Page 41, and having, according thereto, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:
