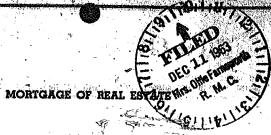

All that lot of land situate on the South Side of Maple Drive, near the Town of Mauldin, in Greenville County, S. C., being shown as Lot 68 on Plat of Peachtree Terrace, made by Dalton & Neves, Engineers, January 1956, recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County, S. C., in Plat Book EE, page 189, and having according to said plat the following metes and bounds, to wit: BEGINNING at an iron pin on the South side of Maple Drive near the intersection of Maple Drive with Ashmore Bridge Road and runs thence along Maple Drive N 88-17 E Forty (40) feet to an iron pin; thence with the curve of Maple Drive (the chord being N 80-52 E One Hundred (100) feet) to an iron pin; thence still with the curve of Maple Drive (the chord being No 70-16 E One Hundred (100) feet) to an iron pin; thence with the curve of Maple Drive and Rosewood Circle (the chord being S 77-0 E Sixty and seven-tenths (60.7) feet) to an iron pin on the Southwest side of Rosewood Circle; thence along Rosewood Circle S 39-0 E Fifty-two (52) feet to an iron pin; thence S 51-0 W One Hundred Ninety-eight and five-tenths (198\5) feet to an iron pin; thence N 53-0 W Two Hundred Thirteen (213) feet to an iron pin on the South side of Maple Drive the beginning corner, and being one of the lots of land conveyed unto F. S. Leake, Sur., F. S. Leake, Jr., and G. Sidney Garrett by E. M. Bishop, by deed dated April 10, 1962, of record in the Office of R.M.C. for Greenville County, S. C., in Deed Book 700 at page 458, and being the same lot of land conveyed unto J. M. Yeargin (also known as Joseph M. Yeargin) and Monnie T. Yeargin by----
