MORTGAGE OF REAL ESTATE

To All Whom These Presents May Concern:

I, William H. Pitts, Jr., of Greenville County

(hereinafter referred to as Mortgagor) SEND(S) GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, the Mortgagor is well and truly indebted unto FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATION OF GREENVILLE, SOUTH CAROLINA (hereinafter referred to as Mortgagee) in the full and just sum of

Eight Thousand and No/100----- (\$ 8,000.00) Dollars, as evidenced by Mortgagor's promissory note of even date herewith, said note to be repaid with interest at the rate

therein specified in installments of Sixty-Four and 08/100----- (\$ 64.08) Dollars each on the first day of each month hereafter, in advance, until the principal sum with interest has been paid in full, such payments to be applied first to the payment of interest, computed monthly on unpaid principal balances, and then to the payment of principal with the last payment, if not sooner paid, to be due and payable 18 years after date; and

WHEREAS, said note further provides that if at any time any portion of the principal or interest due thereunder shall be past due and unpaid for a period of thirty days, or if there shall be any failure to comply with and abide by any By-Laws or the Charter of the Mortgagee, or any stipulations set out in this mortgage, the whole amount due thereunder shall, at the option of the holder thereof become immediately due and payable, and said holder shall have the right to institute any proceedings upon said note and any collaterals given to secure same, for the purpose of collecting said principal due, and interest, with costs and expenses for such proceedings; and

WHEREAS, the Mortgagor may hereafter become indebted to the Mortgagee for such further sums as may be advanced to the Mortgagor's account for the payment of taxes, insurance premiums, repairs, or for any other purpose;

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That the Mortgagor, in consideration of said debt and to secure the payment thereof and any further sums which may be advanced by the Mortgagee to the Mortgagor's account, and also in consideration of the sum of Three Dollars (\$3.00) to the Mortgagor in hand well and truly paid by the Mortgagee at and before the sealing of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold, and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto the Mortgagee, its successors and assigns, the following described real estate:

All that certain piece, parcel, or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or hereafter to be constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, being known and designated as Lots 76, 77, 78, 79, part of Lots 80 and 81 of the Property of Cuttino Heirs as shown on plat thereof being recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book J at Page 121 and having, according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

"BEGINNING at an iron pin on the northern side of an unnamed street (now known as Cuttino Circle), joint front corner of Lots 79 and 80, which point lies 177.2 feet from the northeast intersection of Paris Road (formerly McCarter Shop Road) and Cuttino Circle and running thence with Cuttino Circle, N. 78-31 E. 100 feet to an iron pin; thence Due North along the western side of an unnamed street (now known as Hallcox Street), N. 78-31 E. 148.2 feet to an iron pin at the corner of property now or formerly belonging to Thelma C. Turner; thence with Turner's line, S. 86-55 W. 121.5 feet to an iron pin at the joint corner of Lots 80 and 81; thence along the line of Lot 80, 80 feet to an iron pin; thence across Lot 80, S. 86-50 E. 23 feet to an iron pin in the joint line of Lots 79 and 80; thence with the joint line of said lots, Due South 80.1 feet to the beginning corner; being the same conveyed to me by Paul R. Bancroft and Doris C. Bancroft by deed of even date to be recorded herewith."
