WHEREAS,

Graham G. Gorman

(hereinafter referred to as Mortgagor) is well and truly indebted unto

Suzanne E. Delapp

(hereinafter referred to as Mortgagee) as evidenced by the Mortgagor's promissory note of even date herewith, the terms of which are incorporated herein by reference, in the sum of

Two Thousand Seven Hundred and No/100----- Dollars (\$ 2,700.00) due and payable

in quarterly installments of \$388.70 each, commencing September 1, 1981,
and continuing quarterly for a period of 2 years

with interest thereon from date at the rate of 13 per centum per annum, to be paid: quarterly

WHEREAS, the Mortgagor may hereafter become indebted to the said Mortgagee for such further sums as may be advanced to or for the Mortgagor's account for taxes, insurance premiums, public assessments, repairs, or for any other purposes:

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That the Mortgagor, in consideration of the aforesaid debt, and in order to secure the payment thereof, and of any other and further sums for which the Mortgagor may be indebted to the Mortgagee at any time for advances made to or for his account by the Mortgagee, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars (\$3.00) to the Mortgagor in hand well and truly paid by the Mortgagee at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto the Mortgagee, its successors and assigns:

All that lot of land with the buildings and improvements thereon situate, lying and being on the East end of a 10-foot alley, running East from the Southeast side of Parker Street in the City of Greenville, in Greenville County, South Carolina, being shown as Lot No. 16 on plat of Property of Sam R. Zimmerman, and Ferris M. Williams, made by R. E. Dalton, Engineer, May, 1919, revised February, 1922, recorded in the RMC Office for Greenville County, South Carolina, in Plat Book E, Page 132, and having, according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the East end of a 10-foot alley and running East from the Southeast side of Parker Street in line of property now or formerly of McCain and Groce, and running thence along the line of said McCain and Groce property, S. 82-22 E. 107.8 feet to an iron pin; thence along the rear line of Lots 14 and 15, S. 48-0 W. 125 feet to an iron pin; thence with the line of Lot 17, N. 42-0 W. 38 feet to an iron pin; thence continuing along the line of Lot 17, and along the East end of said 10-foot alley, N. 9-15 E. 71.6 feet to the beginning corner.

TOGETHER with all of the Mortgagor's right, title and interest in and to that alley and the use thereof, 10 feet in width, running across the North edge of Lot 17 on the plat above mentioned, extending East from the Southeast side of Parker Street to the West edge of the property above described, said alley being more particularly described in a deed made by Sam R. Zimmerman to G. P. Stanley, dated May 2, 1925, recorded in the RMC Office for Greenville County, South Carolina, in Deed Book 97 at Page 138.

This is the same property conveyed to the Mortgagor herein by Suzanne E. Delapp of even date to be recorded herewith.

- Together with all and singular rights, members, hereditaments, and appurtenances to the same belonging in any way incident or appertaining, and of all the rents, issues, and profits which may arise or be had therefrom, and including all heating, plumbing, and lighting fixtures now or hereafter attached, connected, or fitted thereto in any manner; it being the intention of the parties hereto that all such fixtures and equipment, other than the usual household furniture, be considered a part of the real estate.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular the said premises unto the Mortgagee, its heirs, successors and assigns, forever.

The Mortgagor covenants that it is lawfully seized of the premises hereinabove described in fee simple absolute, that it has good right and is lawfully authorized to sell, convey or encumber the same, and that the premises are free and clear of all liens and encumbrances except as provided herein. The Mortgagor further covenants to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the Mortgagee forever, from and against the Mortgagor and all persons whomsoever lawfully claiming the same or any part thereof.

The Mortgagor further covenants and agrees as follows:

(1) That this mortgage shall secure the Mortgagee for such further sums as may be advanced hereafter, at the option of the Mortgagee, for the payment of taxes, insurance premiums, public assessments, repairs or other purposes pursuant to the covenants herein. This mortgage shall also secure the Mortgagee for any further loans, advances, readvances or credits that may be made hereafter to the Mortgagor by the Mortgagee so long as the total indebtedness thus secured does not exceed the original amount shown on the face hereof. All sums so advanced shall bear interest at the same rate as the mortgage debt and shall be payable on demand of the Mortgagee unless otherwise provided in writing.

(2) That it will keep the improvements now existing or hereafter erected on the mortgaged property insured as may be required from time to time by the Mortgagee against loss by fire and any other hazards specified by Mortgagee, in an amount not less than the mortgage debt, or in such amounts as may be required by the Mortgagee, and in companies acceptable to it, and that all such policies and renewals thereof shall be held by the Mortgagee, and have attached thereto loss payable clauses in favor of, and in form acceptable to the Mortgagee, and that it will pay all premiums therefor when due; and that it does hereby assign to the Mortgagee the proceeds of any policy insuring the mortgaged premises and does hereby authorize each insurance company concerned to make payment for a loss directly to the Mortgagee, to the extent of the balance owing on the Mortgage debt, whether due or not.

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
