Greenville Man Sentenced on Murder Charge

Thirteenth Circuit Solicitor Walt Wilkins states that DANIEL DE JESUS RANGEL SHERRER, age 23, pled guilty to Murder and Possession of a Weapon during a Violent Crime. The guilty plea came after the prosecution presented its case in full during a jury trial. Rangel-Sherrer was sentenced to 60 years for Murder and 5 years Possession of a Weapon during a Violent Crime by the Honorable Edward W. Miller. Rangel-Sherrer will be required to do every day of the sentence in the South Carolina Department of Corrections.

Evidence presented at the trial by Senior Assistant Solicitor Doug Richardson established that on October 4, 2017, DANIEL DE JESUS RANGEL SHERRER picked up two teenagers from Greenville High School. Rangel-Sherrer drove both girls back to his residence located on Frady Rd. where he took both girls into the woods located on the property in which he resided. Rangel-Sherrer was armed with a .22 caliber cricket rifle. Rangel-Sherrer mistakenly believed he was being followed by an unknown individual and became paranoid that the girls had set him up. Rangel-Sherrer made the girls get down on their knees at which time he put the gun to the forehead of the Victim and shot her. The Victim fell to the ground and Rangel-Sherrer shot her a second time in the temple. He then cut her throat. The second girl was able to escape and called 911. Officers with the Greenville County Sheriff's Office immediately responded along with lead investigator Antonio Bailey. After a 40 minute search, the officers found the body of the Victim deep in the woods. The Victim was 17 years of age at the time of her death.
