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Greenville Men Sentenced for Armed Robberies and Weapons Crimes

Thirteenth Circuit Solicitor Walt Wilkins states that on August 3, 2022, KEYMORE DASHUN BARNWELL, was found guilty by a Greenville County jury of two counts of Armed Robbery with a Deadly Weapon, two counts of Pointing and Presenting a Firearm at a Person, Possession of a Weapon During the Commission of a Violent Crime, and two counts of Criminal Conspiracy. BARNWELL was sentenced by the Honorable Edward W. Miller to 35 years in the South Carolina Department of Corrections.

Evidence presented at trial by the Assistant Solicitor Derek Polsinello established that on January 17, 2019, KEYMORE DASHUN BARNWELL and KENDRELL DE'ANGELO WARREN conspired together and entered the Dollar General located in Mauldin, SC and both defendants were armed with handguns. The defendants pointed their handguns at the store clerk and robbed the store of approximately \$760.00. As BARNWELL was exiting the store, he pointed and presented his handgun at a female who was entering the store with her daughter.

On January 22, 2019, KEYMORE DASHUN BARNWELL and KENDRELL DE'ANGELO WARREN conspired together to rob Spinx gas station located in Mauldin, SC. Evidence at trial showed that BARNWELL dropped WARREN off near Spinx and WARREN entered Spinx gas station armed with a handgun and robbed the store of approximately \$325.00. After dropping WARREN off near Spinx, the vehicle BARNWELL was operating ran out of gas. Due to the getaway vehicle being inoperable, both men fled on foot. The defendants were located by law enforcement and arrested on January 23rd.

The morning of trial, WARREN pled guilty to two counts of Armed Robbery with a Deadly Weapon, two counts of Possession of a Weapon During the Commission of a Violent Crime, and one count of Criminal Conspiracy. However, WARREN refused to cooperate in the prosecution of BARNWELL. After BARNWELL was convicted and sentenced, the Honorable Edward W. Miller sentenced WARREN to 27 years in the South Carolina Department of Corrections. This case was investigated by the Mauldin City Police Department.
