Greenville Man Sentenced to 25 Years for Selling Methamphetamine

Thirteenth Circuit Solicitor Walt Wilkins states that DAVID MITCHELL PADGETT, age 57, pled guilty on February 22, 2024, to Trafficking In Methamphetamine 100-200 grams and sentenced to 25 years in the South Carolina Department of Corrections by the Honorable R. Scott Sprouse.

Evidence presented at the plea hearing by Assistant Solicitor Grace B. Moroney established that on September 28, 2022, DAVID MITCHELL PADGETT agreed to sell four ounces of methamphetamine to an investigator with the Greenville County Multi-Jurisdictional Drug Enforcement Unit ("GCMDEU") who was acting in an undercover capacity. The undercover investigator traveled to meet Mr. Padgett at his residence in Greenville County where he sold 111.25 grams of methamphetamine to the undercover investigator. Subsequently, investigators with the GCMDEU obtained and executed a search warrant upon Mr. Padgett's residence and he was found to be in possession of over three pounds of methamphetamine. The case was investigated by GCMDEU Investigator Chris Montgomery and prosecuted by Assistant Solicitor Grace B. Moroney.
