
**STANDING ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
RE: FIREARMS IN THE COURTROOM**


In the interest of courtroom safety and decorum, any agents of the State who have the power and authority to enforce the criminal laws of the State, and who are considered to be official representatives of the court, **MUST** be in full official uniform to carry a firearm in the courtroom while performing their official duties. In the alternative, if official representatives of the court do not wear their full official uniform in the courtroom, such as probation officers conducting official duties in business suits or other business attire, representatives of the court **MUST** conceal the firearm from plain view, such as under a suit coat. If official representatives of the court are not conducting official duties while in the courtroom, they are prohibited from carrying a firearm for any reason in the courtroom. This order specifically excludes Sheriff's officers and deputies stationed in the courtroom for security purposes. **IT IS SO ORDERED.**
