CALL 911 OR GO TO THE EMERGENCY ROOM IF YOU:



Have difficulty breathing/choking



Have an allergic reaction



Have symptoms of heart attack/stroke



Have unexpected extreme confusion or disorientation



Have difficulty speaking, walking or seeing



Have unexpected sharp or severe pain
