DO NOT CALL 911 OR GO TO THE EMERGENCY ROOM IF YOU:



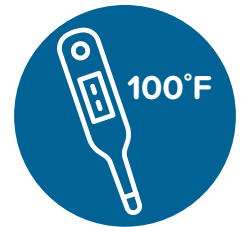

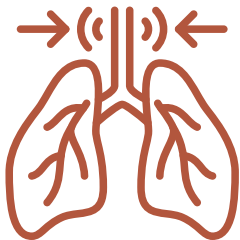

Have an allergic reaction



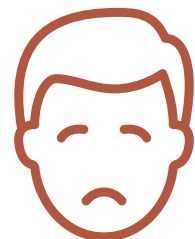
Have symptoms of heart attack/stroke
