Yearly Goals of Greenville County Coroner's Office (2020)

- Expand the number of deputy coroners by at least one additional position to improve
 death scene investigations, documentation and time it takes to perform duties. This will
 also benefit current deputy coroners by increasing safety and decreasing risk of "burn
 out" due to working excessive hours.
- Update the radio system by installing 800 MHz radio in each vehicle assigned to the Coroner, Chief Deputy Coroner, all deputy coroners and spare vehicles assigned to this office to ensure the deputy coroner's have secured communications with all public safety agencies in Greenville County.
- Maintain funding for advanced education as the education needed cannot be found in online classes.
- Maintain funding for appropriate vehicles along with the special equipment needed to perform our specialized jobs in a professional manner.
- Continue to assist other agencies, coroner's offices and educational entities with requested training for their employees.
- Maintain the national certification for the Coroner's Office's Human Remains Detection Canine- the only one in the state of South Carolina.
- Continue to meet the increasing number of indigent families unable to afford final arrangements for their loved ones.

- The Coroner will remain an active participant in the South Carolina Coroners Association as well as maintain membership with the South Carolina Law Enforcement Officer's Agency.
- Create and initiate a collaborative effort with outside or private agencies with the goal
 of early prevention, education and intervention plans to address the communities of
 Greenville County and the increasing numbers of deaths related to illegal and
 prescription drug abuse/misuse.
- Continue to provide the citizens of Greenville County with thorough and unbiased death investigations that meet or exceed the professional standards established for Coroner and Medical Examiners Agencies.
- Update and secure filing system and Coroner's Reporting System.
- Continue to scan case files from previous years and continue until all case files are scanned and up to date.
- Require all deputy coroners to be certified by ABMDI (American Board of Medicolegal Death Investigators) within two years of employment with this office.
