A RESOLUTION

TO PROVIDE FOR THE MILLAGE RATE TO BE LEVIED BY THE BOILING SPRINGS FIRE DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, the Boiling Springs Fire District is a special purpose district located wholly within the County of Greenville; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners for the Boiling Springs Fire District is authorized by law to annually levy, for operations and maintenance, ad valorem property tax millage and by resolution has approved and requested an increase of its present millage rate; and

WHEREAS, according to the provisions contained in S.C. Code §§ 6-11-271 and 6-11-275, as amended, special purpose districts totally located within a county, which were in existence prior to March 7, 1973, and which have the statutory authority to annually levy taxes for operations and maintenance, are authorized to increase their respective millage limitations upon the written approval of the governing body of the county in which they are located.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Greenville County Council approves a total increase of two (2.0) mills for the Boiling Springs Fire District, bringing the total millage for operations and maintenance to twenty-nine and four-tenths (29.4) mills, which consists of operating millage allowable (CPI and population growth) for FY2020-2021 pursuant to S.C. Code § 6-1-320(A)(1) and operating millage allowed but not imposed for the preceding property tax year pursuant to S.C. Code § 6-1-320(A)(2).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the millage increase authorized by this Resolution is effectuated pursuant to S. C. Code §§ 6-11-271 or 6-11-275, as amended.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Auditor and Tax Collector of Greenville County are hereby directed to levy and collect the millage rates authorized by this Resolution.
