Please describe any businesses or structures which require special equipment or represent potentially dangerous calls.
 Our district is a remote area on top of the mountain with winding and steep roadways. It contains the
 Caesar's Head State Park with just under 7,500 acres and 60+ miles of hiking trails, which often require
 lengthy responses for lost or injured hikers, some lasting as long as 8 to 12 hours. Last year's visitors count
 estimate for the state park is well over half a million visitors and the estimates indicate that number will likely
 increase this year!

We also have the 1,400-acre YMCA Camp Greenville in our district. Camp Greenville hosts approximately 4,000 campers each during its six-month summer program and has over 500 events at the Fred W. Symmes Chapel (Pretty Place) during the year.

2. Please list any mutual aid agreements or operational or resource sharing agreements your district participates in with other fire districts.

We have Mutual Aid Agreements with River Falls Fire Department, Greenville County Firefighters Association & EM, and are also listed with the SC Firefighter Mobilization at SC State Fire.

- 3. Please describe how, if at all, the requested millage increase will impact your district's ISO ratings.

 With costs continuing to steadily increase, especially in recent months, we need an increase to allow us to continue the level of service that we currently provide. We are awaiting the delivery later this Fall of a new engine to replace our 1997 model "first out/primary" pumper. We have submitted a separate request requesting help with funding to put towards the down payment for the new truck.
- 4. Please describe the tax-exempt properties in your district and the services you provide to these entities. We provide services to Caesar's Head State Park and YMCA Camp Greenville. Providing these services may involve large numbers of personnel and can take anywhere from a couple of hours to as much as twelve or more hours and may also involve complex and dangerous operations.
