South Carolina Opioid Recovery Fund (SCORF)
Guaranteed Political Subdivision (GPS) Subfund FY27 Application
April 13, 2026

- The South Carolina Opioid Recovery Fund Board (“SCORF Board”) was created by the South Carolina Opioid Recovery Act to administer and disburse the South Carolina Opioid Recovery Fund. Money from the fund is distributed by the SCORF Board to help address and remediate the impact of the opioid epidemic in South Carolina.
- SCORF Funds must be only for treatment, prevention or other strategies that include training and research. Funds cannot be used supplant existing local, state or federal funds.
- In 2024, with the approval of County Council, Greenville County worked with local behavioral health experts as well as the highest need departments to develop a comprehensive 3-year plan to address the Opioid Crisis in Greenville County through the use of SCORF funds.
- Greenville County and partners have shown success in the following areas related to Opioid Use Disorder (OUD):
 - Treating and supporting pregnant and postpartum women
 - Providing assistance with detox, testing, counseling and peer support
 - Reversing overdoses
 - Testing and providing supports for adults in the detention center
- Applications for year 3 of the 3-year project are due May 2, 2026.
