

AN ORDINANCE

TO APPROVE THE OLD MILL ESTATES SPECIAL TAX DISTRICT COMMISSIONERS' REQUEST FOR AN INCREASE TO ITS CURRENT AD VALOREM PROPERTY TAX MILLAGE LEVY.

WHEREAS, on June 20, 1995, the Greenville County Council, acting pursuant to S.C. Code § 4-9-30(5)(a)(ii), adopted Ordinance No. 2735, establishing the Old Mill Estates Special Tax District to provide for the health, safety, and welfare within the district by installing and maintaining street lights, controlling litter and other health hazards along the public rights-of-way within the district, and maintaining and promoting improvements for the entrances, exits, and rights-of-way within the district, and

WHEREAS, Greenville County Ordinance No. 2735 authorizes the Old Mill Estates Special Tax District to levy annually and collect *ad valorem* property tax in an amount not to exceed ten (10) mills for operations and maintenance, and

WHEREAS, the Old Mill Estates Special Tax District Commissioners have presented a budget projection and millage request to Greenville County Council providing for the expenditure of revenues acquired by the District pursuant to *ad valorem* property taxes and

WHEREAS, the Old Mill Estates Special Tax District Commissioners have requested a three and three-tenths (3.3) mills increase to the District's current millage rate for continued operations and maintenance, which will increase their millage from six and seven-tenths (6.7) to ten (10) mills.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY GREENVILLE COUNTY COUNCIL:

Section 1. Millage Rate and Tax Levy. Greenville County Council approves an increase of three and three-tenths (3.3) mills, as allowed under the Code of Laws for South Carolina, bringing the total millage for operations and maintenance to ten (10) mills for the Old Mill Estates Special Tax District, as requested.

The Auditor and Tax Collector of Greenville County are directed to levy and collect taxes in accordance with this Ordinance

Section 2. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect upon the date of its adoption.
