Letter to the Citizens


Dear Citizens,



The Greenville Area Development Corporation was established by Greenville County Council to promote and enhance the economic growth and development of Greenville County. Since its founding in 2001, GADC efforts have resulted in the creation of more than 23,000 new jobs and more than \$4 billion in capital investment in Greenville County, SC.



Greenville County EMS has earned Mission Lifeline Gold Plus Status from the American Heart Association (AHA) in recognition of continued achievements in pre-hospital care of cardiac/STEMI patients. The County has also successfully launched PulsePoint, a smartphone app that engages citizens in providing lifesaving assistance to victims of sudden cardiac arrest.




Greenville County Government




Greenville County Council

With more than 490,000 full-time residents, Greenville County is South Carolina's most populated county. The County's support of public transportation has allowed Greenlink to continue to grow and expand its services. Greenlink now features 11 fixed routes to destinations all across Greenville County. Those busses are accessible for mobility devices and are equipped with a bike rack.



Summary of Financial Information

The County's Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) is presented in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP). The presentation of this report differs from GAAP because the data presented is only for the primary government which includes all Greenville County governmental functions. The Greenville County Redevelopment Authority and the Greenville County Library System are excluded.

Governmental activities of Greenville County include the general government, public safety, highways and streets, economic development, judicial services, health and welfare, and culture and recreation. Governmental activities generally are financed through taxes and intergovernmental revenues.

Business-type activities include solid waste disposal, storm water quality and control, and the parking facility. These activities are intended to recover all or a significant portion of their costs through user fees and charges.

Balance Sheet

More formally referred to as the Statement of Net Position (assets minus liabilities), the balance sheet reflects Greenville County's strong financial position.

Explanations Of Major Fluctuations:

The decrease in net position for the governmental activities is primarily due to an increase in net pension liability which was partially offset by a decrease in other long-term liabilities. A slight increase in accounts payable at year-end contributed to the decrease in net position for the business type activities.



Greenville County's Litter Ends Here program provides citizens with the "litter tracker app" which gives users a way to easily report problem areas to our litter team. Litter crews have used the county's two litter vacuum trucks to collect more than 110,000 pounds of litter from our roads in less than one year.

Explanations of Major Fluctuations:


The overall decrease in net position of governmental activities is mostly due to an increase in general services, public safety and law enforcement expenses which were partially offset by increases in property tax and grants/contribution revenue. The overall decrease in the net position of the business-type activities is mainly due to an increase in expenditures for the solid waste division.




The South Carolina Association of Counties awarded Greenville County the 2017 Barrett-Lawrimore Memorial Regional Cooperation Award for an innovative partnership in creating Imap, a dynamic interactive online map that connects citizens with essential human services within the County. Revenue Sources – Governmental Activities




Expenses – Governmental Activities



Economic Impact of Sports Tourism

Greenville County hosts and supports sporting events that bring thousands of visitors to our area each year. Their spending creates jobs, helps businesses grow, and provides tax dollars that help build and support recreation amenities used year round by residents and guests.



In 2017, Greenville County Animal Care launched a program to offer free spay/neuter surgery for large breed dogs, available to all residents of Greenville County.
