LONG RANGE PLANNING

FIVE YEAR REVIEW

As mandated by state law, the Planning Commission has undertaken a thorough review of Greenville County's adopted Comprehensive Plan, marking a pivotal moment in our county's commitment to strategic, community-driven development.

Over the past year, Long Range Planning staff conducted an extensive engagement process, connecting with community members, stakeholders, and key partners throughout the county. This collaborative effort aimed to prepare a comprehensive status report examining both data projections and proposed initiatives outlined in our Comprehensive Plan.

Community participation formed the heart of this review process. Planning staff held multiple meetings strategically located across various county regions, ensuring residents from diverse geographic areas had meaningful opportunities to engage. During these sessions, community members received key updates and were actively invited to share insights, concerns, and recommendations. This grassroots feedback proved invaluable, directly influencing the final structure and content of the Five Year Review.

The document also reflects a comprehensive internal assessment by planning staff, who systematically reached out to partners and funding sources identified within the Comprehensive Plan's initiatives. This dual approach—combining community voices with professional partner perspectives—created a robust evaluation foundation.

The gathered feedback enabled staff to present detailed progress updates across the full spectrum of goals, objectives, and initiatives. The Planning Commission will receive a comprehensive overview celebrating significant accomplishments from the past five years while providing clear insight into ongoing initiatives and challenges Greenville County continues to navigate.

The review's findings will be presented during a workshop scheduled for **August 21st**, after which the document will be made publicly available online at **www.GCPlanning.org**, ensuring all residents have access to this vital information about our county's planning progress and future direction.

OPEN SPACE PLAN

In a significant step toward preserving Greenville County's natural landscapes, Alta Planning + Design will present the finalized Open Space Plan to the Greenville County Planning Commission on August 21st alongside the Five Year Review. Initiated in October 2024, this comprehensive planning effort reflects an extensive, community-driven process aimed at safeguarding the county's open spaces, natural habitats, and working lands amidst rapid growth. The plan builds on the 2020 Plan Greenville County Comprehensive Plan and the 2010 Greenville County Comprehensive Greenways Plan, addressing the community's growing concerns about the loss of greenspace due to development.

The development of the Open Space Plan involved robust community engagement, including multiple layers of public input, stakeholder meetings, and two county-wide surveys. These efforts ensured that the plan reflects the priorities and vision of Greenville County residents, who value the area's unparalleled quality of life and proximity to stunning natural areas. Alta Planning + Design collaborated with county leaders, planning staff, and residents to craft a strategic vision for open space preservation, sustainable growth, and long-term land management over the next decade. The plan identifies key initiatives, including priority capital projects, land acquisitions, trail corridors, and innovative funding mechanisms, while fostering partnerships with landowners, developers, and institutions.

Greenville County, South Carolina's most populous county, faces projections of an additional 206 square miles of urban land by 2040. The Open Space Plan serves as a roadmap to balance this growth with the preservation of community character and natural resources. This milestone presentation marks a pivotal moment in ensuring Greenville County remains a vibrant, sustainable community for current and future generations.

GPATS TRANSPORTATION MANAGEMENT AREA CERTIFICATION REVIEW





However, demolition has been completed on three of the four condemned structures slated for demolition on Minus Street in the Sterling Community and one structure on 3rd Street in Woodside. The last structure on Minus Street requiring demolition is scheduled to begin mid-August.

A request for bids has been issued for demolition of a nuisance structure on Rosebay Drive in the Dove Tree Subdivision. Should the proposed schedule be maintained as anticipated, this structure should be demolished by the end of September or beginning of October.
