

AN ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR AN INCREASE IN THE AD VALOREM PROPERTY TAX LEVY FOR THE ASHWICKE SPECIAL TAX DISTRICT TO OFFSET A DEFICIENCY.

WHEREAS, the Ashwicke Special Tax District was formed in 1989 and is authorized by Ordinance No. 1949 to annually levy ad valorem property tax millage to carry out its purposes, and the Ashwicke Special Tax District Commissioners requested a millage increase in said levy to carry on operations and cure a projected deficiency in funds; and

WHEREAS, the Ashwicke Special Tax District had substantially lowered its millage rate in past years to bring the tax rate in the community down, and the Ashwicke Special Tax District Commissioners have previously received a small millage increase resulting with a total millage levy of one (1.0) mill for operations pursuant to Ordinance No. 4292; and

WHEREAS, the Ashwicke Special Tax District Commissioners had requested an additional levy of eleven (11.0) mills to satisfy a deficiency in order to maintain future operations.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY GREENVILLE COUNTY COUNCIL:

Section 1. Millage and Tax Levy. Greenville County Council hereby approves an increase of eleven (11.0) mills to offset a deficiency in order to maintain future operations pursuant to S.C. Code Ann. § 6-1-320(B)(2) bringing the total millage the Ashwicke Special Tax District to twelve (12.0) mills. The Auditor and Tax Collector of Greenville County are hereby directed to levy and collect taxes in accordance with this Ordinance, to include any necessary billings in the current year.

Section 2. Repeal. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance, or inconsistent with its provisions, are hereby repealed or superseded to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect upon the date of its adoption.
