Beginning on Tuesday, May 26th, Greenville County will open four Satellite Absentee Voting locations for voters to cast an absentee ballot for the June 9th Primaries. Voters may visit any of the four sites to cast an “in person” absentee ballot before the June Primary. Voters are reminded that proper photo identification is required and that these sites are NOT taking any request for mail-in absentee ballots. These sites are ONLY for voters voting their own ballot. These sites will open at 9 AM and will remain open until 4:30 PM, Monday through Friday. These satellite offices will be open until Friday June 5th. Absentee voting in person at County Square has longer hours, extended days for absentee voting in person, and ability to handle address changes when a voter has NOT updated their Voter Registration information for voting purposes.

Voters still have the ability to request a Primary ballot by mail by calling the County Voter Registration office, absentee department at (864) 467-7264 and requesting an application be mailed for signature and returned for a ballot to be mailed. Voters wishing to use the by-mail process are requested to begin NOW. With two mailings, a last minute request may not be timely and could cost a missed voting opportunity.

Additionally, only approximately 30% of Greenville County have a Democratic Party ballot as Democratic Primaries do NOT include the entire County, just US Congressional District 3, SC State Senate District 7, and SC House of Representative District 25 have Democratic primaries being conducted. There are Republican primaries throughout the County.
