McCullough, Jr., and Frances McCullough in the State aforesaid in consideration of the sum of twelve hundred dollars, of which \$5.00 is paid to us, in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by

Joseph A. McCullough (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said Joseph A. McCullough, all that certain tract or parcel of land containing forty-five and one-half acres, Beginning on a post-oak 3.30n and running N. 89 W. 37.00 to a stake or stone on the Augusta Road; thence up said Road N. 13.25 to a post-oak 3X; thence along Cooleys Bridge Road 26.00 to a post-oak 3X; thence to a stump 3X; thence N. 3 E. 14.50 to beginning, bounded by lands formerly of John W. McCullough, Archie Ramsay and James McCullough and being the same land conveyed to John W. McCullough as Trustee by James McCullough on the said 16th., day of May, 1884, which deed is recorded in R.M.C. office for said County and State, Book P.P. page 601.

TOGETHER with, all and singular, the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular, the said premises before mentioned unto the said Joseph A. McCullough, his heirs and assigns, forever.

AND we do hereby bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and administrators, to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Joseph A. McCullough, his

heirs and assigns, against ourselves and our heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same, or any part thereof.
