Stewart and his heirs and assigns forever all the right, title, interest, estate, claim and demand whatsoever which we, the said D.I. Collins and D.A. Collins or either of us, now have or might at any time hereafter assert in and to that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina and County of Greenville, in O'Neal Township, about five miles south-east of Tygerville, and about two and a half miles from Sandy-Flat, on both sides of Gold Mine Branch of South Tyger River, having the following metes and bounds, according to a plat thereof made by Will D. Neves bearing date January 6, 1904 to-wit: Beginning at a stone 3XNM (in place of hickory gone) a short distance from the Gold Mine Branch, and running thence N. 73° W. 5.15 chains to a Pine knot and Stone 3X0M; thence N. 11° W. 7.70 chs. to a stone 3X0M; thence S. 70° W. 39.70 chs. to a stone 3X0m near and slightly North of the said Gold Mine Branch; thence along line of land now or formerly belonging to W.Gilreath S. $1-\frac{1}{2}$ ° E. 23.10 chs.
