KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That Her Henry Percival, Henry S.
Percival and The General Percival, of the County of
Greenville.

in the State aforesaid
Two Thousand Fifty and no^o DOLLARS,
to rest in hand paid
at and before the sealing of these presents by Butler Bates

(the receipt whereof

is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release, unto the said
Butler Bates, All that certain lot of land about two and
one-half acres, being of the Greenville Township in the County
and State aforesaid, on the head waters of Richland
creek of Greedy river, beginning on a P. C. and running
thence South thirty-nine (39) East 4.60 chains to a stone,
thence North fifteen and one-half (15 $\frac{1}{2}$) East 5.03 to a stone,
thence South seventy-three and one-half (73 $\frac{1}{2}$) West four
hundred forty-two (442) to the beginning corner, contain-
ing one acre, more or less, and bounded by lands of
M. Moore, Charlie Meaus and Mrs. May V. Sullivan; also that
other parcel of land in said County and State West of the
above-described lot containing one fourth of an acre,
more or less, beginning on a stone and running thence
South seven (7) East 2.07 chains to a stone; thence North
fifty-five, and one-half (55 $\frac{1}{2}$) East 1.50 to an iron axle;
thence North seven (7) East one hundred seventy-one
(171) to a stone; thence South seventy-three and one-half
(73 $\frac{1}{2}$) West 1.10 to beginning corner, bounded by lands of
P. L. Foster, Henry Bates and others, and being a part
of the same lands conveyed to Jennie A. Percival by
W. H. Divine by his deed dated October 1st 1893, and
recorded in the R. M. C. office for said Greenville County
in deed Book 21, page 348, the said Jennie A. Percival
having died intestate leaving as her sole heirs and
distributess the grantors, her husband Henry Percival
her son, Henry S. Percival, and daughter Theodora Percival
who became seized and possessed in fee simple of said
land upon her death, said land was conveyed to W. H.
Divine by Trustees of Hardwicke Poor School, deed dated
April 2nd, 1892, and to W. H. Divine by D. P. Verner, Master,
deed recorded in deed book 21, page 20.
