Agreement to sell land.

This AGreement made and entered into this the 17th, day of March 1919, between The Bank of Commerce of the one part and W.D. Norflett of the other part, Witnesseth:

In consideration of the money paid and to be paid as is hereinefter stated, the said Pank has bargained and will convey as hereinefter stated to the said Norflett that certain lot, with church building thereon situate, in said City and County of Greenville, S.C. located on alley leading from St.John Street described in deed to said Bank.

The purchase price is Twelve hundred dollars, Seventy-five of which has been paid, leaving a balance of Eleven hundred and twenty-five dollars to be paid.

The said remainder to be paid at the rate of Thirty-six dollars every three months, the first payment due January 15th, 1919, and this to continue the first year from october 15th, 1918 and from then to pay the sum of Forty dollars every three months until principal and interest is paid, all unpaid portions to draw interest from October 15th, 1918 until paid at the rate of eight per cent per annum, expedie annually, and if not so paid, to draw interest at the same rate as the principal.

If any payment is not 113 then he, the said Benk thereupon may re-enter and take possession and remove all parties therefrom, and it is agreed that all cums to that time paid shall be held by the Bank as rent for said promises. The said Morflett will keep the property insured for the benefit of said Bank and pay all taxes and insurance premiums and keep the building in good repair. When said sum and interest shall have in accordance herewith been paid in full, said Bank will make a dood to said Morflett, and convey to him said property.
