Minutes of Meeting held by the stockholders of the Simpsonville Mercantile and Manufacturing

Company, at Simpsonville, S.C. at ten o'clock, A.M. March 10th, 1919.

Pursuant to a call duly published by the board of directors of this corporation for thirty days, and also pursuant to written notice directed to the stockholders of the said corporation thirty days in advence of the holding of the said meeting, this meeting was held to consider whether or not this corporation should go into liquidation and wind up its affairs.

All of the stockholders of said corporation were present and participated in the conduct of business at the meeting. The following resolution was introduced and adopted without opposition:-"Whereas, the capital stock of the Simpsonville Mercantile and

Manufacturing Company is now entirely owned by T.R. Cox and R.D. Jones, who are officers and directors of the said corporation, and whereas it is desired by the said officers, directors and stockholders that the Simpsonville Mercantile and Manufacturing Company be dissolved as a corporation, wind up its affairs and cease to exist.
