Barton of the State and County aforesaid (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release, unto the said

Barton, his heirs and assigns, all of that certain piece, parcel and tract of land situate in the State and County aforesaid, about one mile below Simpsonville on both sides of the Reedy Ferry road adjoining lands of W. H. C. Barton, James Richardson and others, being a part of a tract of land purchased by me from Mary E.
