NOW, KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That ie H. D. Parish et al. and T. C. Gause et al. in the State aforesaid in consideration of the sum of Two Dollars and a half and other considerations - DOLLARS, to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by John B. Marshall.

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these Presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said John B. Marshall, all that piece of land known as lot No. 8 of the lands purchased by Mountain City and Improvement Company from C. W. Cardwell, as shown in the Plat made by J. W. Southern, D. S., October 15th, 1875, being just beyond the limits of the city of Greenville, on the right hand, northeast by the Sumcombe Road and running the following metes and bounds to wit: Beginning at the corner of lot No. 11 and in line of Sumcombe road, thence down Sumcombe road 60 feet to and from said line to said corner and corner of lot No. 7, then with said corner in lot No. 66-44 1. one hundred and seven and (100) feet to another corner in line, i.e. between 3 and 33, thence with line of lot No. 32, 71. 23-34 ft. less (60) feet, to an iron-spur in corner lots 32, 31 and 11, thence with line of lot No. 11. 3. 66-44 1. one hundred and ninety-three (193) feet to the beginning corner containing twenty-six one hundredths of an acre more or less and being the same lot of land conveyed to Edward B. Miller, Mountain City Land and Improvement Company by deed dated May 24th, 1875, and recorded in the R. M. C. office for Greenville County Book 999, page 205, and so dissolved by Miller to me by deed dated June 20th, 1876 and recorded in the R. M. C. office for Greenville County in Vol 36, page 129.

TOGETHER with, all and singular, the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining. TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular, the said premises before mentioned unto the said John B. Marshall, his heirs and assigns, forever.

AND we do hereby bind ourselves and our heirs, executors and administrators, to warrant and forever defend, all and singular, the said premises unto the said John B. Marshall, his heirs and assigns, against ourselves and our heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same, or any part thereof.
