Frank Smith, their heirs and assigns, all that certain piece, parcel, or lot of land situate, lying and being in Greenville City, Greenville County, South Carolina, on the west side of River Street; adjoining lot formerly owned by Arthur E. Bradick. Beginning at a stake in the southeast corner of said Arthur E. Bradick lot, and running thence with said lot N. 62 3/4 W. One Hundred and Seventy feet to a stake on line of lot No. 5, thence N. 2 1/4 E. Seventy feet to the right of way of railway company, thence S. 62 3/4 E. One hundred and Seventy-three feet to a stake, on river street, thence with River street, S. 24 1/4 W. Sixty-four feet to the beginning corner, being lot No. 3 on a survey of S. N.
