KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That *I, E. T. Grannell*

in the State aforesaid,

in consideration of the sum of

Three Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty $\frac{9}{100}$ DOLLARS

to *J. A. Martin* in hand paid

at and before the sealing of these presents by *J. A. Martin*

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said

J. A. Martin, his heirs and assigns, the following described real estate, to wit: All that piece, parcel and tract of land situate, lying and being in the County and State aforesaid bounded by lands of Henry Hawkins, Mr. King, John Jones, and other lands of E. T. Grannell, according to a plat made by W. A. Adams, Surveyor Dec. 6th, 1917, and having the following metes and bounds:

Beginning at an iron pin in Laurens (Rt.) Road, Mr. King's corner and running thence N. 80° 21'. 5.30 along said road; thence 76.57 ft. N. 4.87 along said road; thence N. 41° 47' N. 5.39 along said road; thence N. 34° 34' N. 9.31 along said road to iron pin in center of said road, joint corner of E. T. Grannell and John Jones, thence leaving said Laurens road and running with line of John Jones N. 51° 14' E. 17.25 to stone, Henry Hawkins' corner, thence N. 84° 13' E. 18.30 to pine stump, Mr. King's corner, thence S. 26° 12' N. 30.60 along King's line to the beginning corner in said Laurens road, containing forty-eight (48) acres, more or less, and being a part of the same land conveyed to me by G. J. Fowler by deed dated Sept. 15th, 1905, and recorded in the office of the R. R. C. for Greenville County in Book 000 at page 532.
