KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That Mrs. O. M. and C. W. Mitchell of Greenville County

in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of One dollar and for love and affection... to us in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by E. F. Williamson of Greenville County

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said

E. F. Williamson, all that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, situate, lying and being in Greenville County and State aforesaid on the east side of the Capt. Creek public road, beginning at an iron pin in the center of the said road and running N 19 1/2 E. 4.00 chains to a stone, thence N 4 E. 9.96 chains to a stone on D. W. Reese line, thence S 69 E. 17.36 chains to a stone near a white oak, near a public road, thence S 50 1/2 E. 2.19 chains to a stone in the swamp, thence S 52 3/4 E. 1.88 chains to a stake (offset corner) near a branch, thence N 50 1/2 E. 1.46 chains to a stake near branch, thence S 24 1/2 E. 2.70 chains to a stake in the edge of said branch near an ash 3 m, thence S 55 2/3 E. 2.64 chains to an iron pin near the center of the Capt. Creek road, thence up said road N 22 1/2 W. 12.50 chains to the beginning corner, containing about one + 16/100 (31.16) acres more or less, the whole being one third of the M. V. Mitchell estate, Deed of which is recorded in P. M. C. Greenville S. C. Vol. V. V. V. page 149, April 10th. 1904, and agreed to, and accepted by E. F. Williamson (according to a survey and plat made by M. C. Christopher May 16th. 1908) as her share of the Mitchell (Mrs. M. V. Mitchell's) estate and agreed to and signed by C. W. and O. M. Mitchell, the other parties concerned. Bound on the north by lands of Rollins, on the east by lands of C. W. Mitchell, on the south by lands of C. W. Mitchell and the West by lands of C. W. Mitchell.

TOGETHER with all and singular, the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular, the said premises before mentioned, unto the said E. F. Williamson, his heirs and assigns, forever.

AND we do hereby bind heirs, executors and administrators, to warrant and forever defend, all and singular, the said premises unto the said E. F. Williamson, his heirs and assigns, against us and our heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same, or any part thereof.


