(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release  
unto the said Madeline Jackson (her heirs) and assigns

forever all that certain lot of land, situated  
in the State and County aforesaid, near  
the Eastern limits of the City of Greenville,  
in vicinity known as Nickelston and  
known as lot No. 5 of Block "A" of  
Jefferson Heights, as shown by plat of  
record in the office of the R. M. C. Job  
Greenville County, in Plat book Vol. "JC"  
Pages 34 and 35, (said having the following  
metes and bounds to wit):-

Beginning at a pin on the East side  
of First Avenue, joint corner of Lots Nos.  
84 and 5 and running thence N. 81-40 E.  
87 feet, 5 inches to a pin, thence S. 0-30 W. 25  
feet, 5 inches to pin, thence S. 81-40 W. 87 feet,  
5 inches to pin on First Avenue; thence with
