the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release  
unto the said W. P. Vaughan all that real estate, personal estate,

tract of land lying and being in Butler Township,  
Greenville County, South Carolina, known as the  
home place of the late Elisha A. Hammond,  
adjoining lands of W. F. Burgess, Walter Holcombe,  
John Ellis and others, and containing twenty acres  
by estimation, and being more fully described by  
metes and bounds, courses and distances as will
