to me paid by the said Fannie Louise Stenhouse and Annie Mays Green

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release
unto the said Fannie Louise Stenhouse and Annie Mays Green, the following described real-estate

to-wit: "All those certain pieces, parcels and tracts of land situate, lying and being in the
County and State aforesaid, and being known and designated as Tracts Nos. 1 and 2 of the lands
of the Dr. F.R. League estate, according to a survey and sub-division thereof made by W.A. Adams,
