(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, sell and Release unto the said

J. D. Lewis. All that certain piece, parcel, or lot of land situate, lying and being near Graceland Cemetery in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina and having the following metes and bounds to wit: according to survey made by R. E. Dalton, January 1920:

Commencing at an iron pin at the Southeast corner of White and Railroad Streets, thence along the East side of White Street S. 15° 0' E. 387.5 feet to an iron pin, thence along line now or formerly of J. T. Gillespie N. 74. 50' E. 137 feet to a pin of line of Dr Smith property; thence along line of said property N. 14. 20' E. 352 feet to a stake on the South side of Railroad Street; thence along the South side of said Street S. 89. 02' W. 145 feet to the pin at the point of beginning.

For value received I hereby release from the within described land the lien of a certain mortgage executed and delivered to me by J. T.
