the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said,

M. J. Goodlett and O. M. Goodlett, their heirs and assigns forever, the following described real estate:

All that certain piece parcel or lot of land situate lying and being in the City of Greenville, State and County aforesaid and described as follows: Beginning at an iron pin on the right-of-way of Columbia and Greenville Railroad (now Southern Railway) 200 feet Northwest of Hudson Street and at the corner of the lot now owned by Petroleum Oil Company and running thence with its line and parallel with Hudson Street 200 feet to a stake; thence N. 40 W. 350 feet to a stake; thence in a line parallel with Hudson Street in a southerly direction 200 feet to a stake on said right-of-way; thence with said right-of-way S. 40 E. 350 feet to the beginning corner.
