Begins at a single pine, on branch and running thence N. 13 1/8 E. .51 to a stone post; thence S. 6 1/2 W. 19.32 to a stone in old road 3m.; thence W. 19.32 to a iron pin; thence S. 56 1/2 E. 3.35 to branch thence up the side of said branch to the beginning corner, said land being a part of that tract of land conveyed to S.L. King by Lawrence Stever, Nov. 29th, 1913 and recorded in the office of R.M.C. for Greenville County in Volume 25, at page 470.

Also that tract of land adjoining the above described tract, containing two acres, or less, bounded (2.56) acres, more or less: Beginning at an iron pin or Greenville road or P.L.
