Office for Greenville County, being the same lot of land conveyed to the grantor by A. M. Rush and J. N. Bell by their deed recorded in R. M. C. office for Greenville County in Volume 35, page 121.

(8) All that piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being in the County of Greenville, in the State aforesaid, beginning at a point 100 feet in an easterly direction from the intersection of Franklin Road and Burncombe Road and running thence from an iron pin one hundred feet in an easterly direction along the north side of Burncombe Road to the corner of lot No. 6; thence in a northerly direction one hundred and twenty feet to the corner of lot No. 3; thence 100 feet in a westerly direction to an iron pin; thence in a southerly direction one hundred and twenty feet to the beginning corner, said lot being known as lot No. 1 of a resurvey of the lands of the Suburban Land Company, the said lot being

Beginning at a stake on Franklin Road and on the east bank of Langston Creek and running thence with the run of Langston Creek in a southeasterly direction 2300 feet to a stake, corner of lands now or formerly of Tanner; thence N. 55° E. 332 feet in aches to a Catalpa tree at corner of lands of Sans Souci Country Club; thence with said lands N. 15° 30' E. 120 feet to iron pin; thence still with line of said Country Club N. 11° 41' W. 502 1/2 feet to iron pin; thence still with line of said Country Club N. 24° 30' E. 1162 1/2 feet to iron pin on Franklin Road, thence with said Road N. 70° 50' W. 1036 1/2 feet to the beginning being the same land conveyed to the grantor by Lucy B. Perry by deed dated March 29, 1922, and recorded in R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Volume 73, page 553.
