

two suitable showcases; said party of the first part agrees to leave said premises under the said party of the second part for 15% of the gross sales of the said party of the second part, settlements to be made at the end of each and every business day.

The said party of the second part in consideration of the said premises agrees to and with the said party of the first part to leave the said above described premises for the period herein mentioned, and to pay there for the sum of 15% of the gross sales made by the said party of the second part, all settlements to be made at the end of each and every business day; and the said party of the second part agrees to use the said premises solely for the purpose of conducting a millinery establishment therein.

It is further mutually agreed by and between the said parties that all the conditions and concurrences hereinabove set forth shall extend to and bind the heirs, administrators and executors of both of said parties.
