(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold, and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said William Goldsmith with his heirs, executors and assigns all of that piece, plot or lot in Springwood Cemetery, in the City of Greenville, County and State above named, being of the surface only of the lot # 91 Conveyed by the City Council of Greenville to J. O. Alexander on account 18th, 1897, having the following dimensions, to wit: South side six feet (6); North side seven and one half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) feet; East eighteen feet (18); and West side eighteen ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) feet; East eighteen feet (18); and West side eighteen ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) feet; that is to say it is the intention of the grantor herein to convey to the grantees Eastern half of said lot # 91, beginning from the drive way the entire depth of the lot. Right also given to place curbing between the lot herein Conveyed and the remainder of lot # 91 now bounded by me on that portion of my lot not herein Conveyed.

This Conveyance is made for the right of burial and interment purposed, and to be used exclusively for the right and purpose aforesaid, and subject to the conditions of the Charter of the City Council of Greenville, and all revisions of thereof, and amend- ments that may be made thereto, and also subject to the ordinances of said City and the rules, regulations and by laws of the City Council and Cemetery Trustees, or Committee now in force, or which may hereafter be passed, relating to said Cemetery and the funeral of the dead therein.

The above described land is the same conveyed to J. O. Alexander by City Council of Greenville on the 18th day of August 1897, deed recorded in office of Register of Deeds of Greenville County in Book D.D. 2 page 172.

TOGETHER with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining.  
TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular, the said premises before mentioned, unto the said

William Goldsmith, his

executors, heirs, and assigns, forever.

AND Agnes Hill do hereby bind

heirs, executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend, all and singular, the said premises unto the said

William Goldsmith, his

heirs and assigns, against

D.L.C. and

heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same, or any part thereof.
