the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said,

Lapoper-Hurst Company; All that tract or lot of land in Darlington Precinct, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, and described as follows: Beginning at a stone near the center of the Augusta Road at junction of Horse Creek Road, and running thence N. 39° 34' E. 316 to stone in latter road; thence S. 53° 14' E. 317 to the beginning, containing one (1) acre, more or less and bounded by lands of Bacon. Being the same land conveyed to W. J. O'Brien by J. F. Baugh my deed dated April 12, 1920, and recorded in Volume 63, page 536.
