Know all men by these presents, that I, J. Robt. Martin for and in consideration of the rental hereinbefore mentioned agree to lease and by these presents do lease unto George A. Kavanic, C. Barnhouse and John Mavromat, the Greenville Lunch Room located at 321 S. Main Street, from Nov. 1st 1923 to April 1st 1924 for the sum of One hundred (\$100.00) Dollars per month and beginning Apr. 1st, 1924, the entire floor of what is known as the Barr Building, including the Painted Signs now occupied on the corner the Painting block in the rear and the basement underneath said floor for the remainder of the year 1924 and for the years 1925, 1926, 1927 and 1928, rents to be paid as follows; Two Hundred Fifty (\$250.00) Dollars per month from Apr. 1st, 1924 to Jan. 1st, 1925; Two Hundred Twenty-five (\$225.00) Dollars per month for the year 1925; Two Hundred Eighty-five (\$285.00) Dollars per month for the years 1926, 1927 and 1928; and rents to be paid on the first day of Dec. 1923 and on the first day of each subsequent month thereafter on the amounts hereinabove provided.

To have and to hold the said premises unto the said George A. Kavanic, C. Barnhouse and John Mavromat, their executors, administrators and assigns for term or terms, provided, however, that said George A. Kavanic, C. Barnhouse and John Mavromat shall not sub-rent or lease said place or any portion thereof to any party or parties undesirable to said J. Robt. Martin and without his written consent thereto.

The lessee above named agree to be responsible for the keeping of the said premises and to make good all breakage and injuries to the same, except those resulting from ordinary wear and tear and natural decay, and agree to leave said premises back to the lessor at the expiration of lease term in as good condition as received, wear and tear alone excepted.

The lessor is to replace plate glass in front of Greenville Lunch Room on or by Nov. 1st 1923.

The lessor, J. Robt. Martin, agrees not to rent any portion of the store immediately north of the premises herein, now occupied by P. N. Martin Furniture Company, for either a fruit stand or cafe.

The lessee are to make their own arrangements of and in the way of changes suitable for their convenience to pay their own water, lights, and gas rents, provided however, no other doors or windows are to be cut in brick wall and no other entrances are to be made to the basement other than the one from East Broad

street and the ones at the east end of basement over steps non-existent;
