William Beattie, all that certain lot, piece or parcel of land situate, lying and being in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, in the fifth Ward of the City of Greenville, known and designated as lot No. three $\frac{1}{2}$, or a part of my property, made by W. A. Benzeliz, dated September 14, 1852 and having according to said plat, the following lines and bounds, to-wit: Beginning at an iron pin on the west side of Greene Avenue on the south-east corner of lot No. two $\frac{1}{2}$, as shown on said plat, said pin being two hundred and eight and four-tenths feet southward from Anderson Street, and running thence $\frac{1}{2}$ N. $67^{\circ} 30'$ W. one hundred (100) feet giving line or lot No. two to an iron pin on line of lot No. seven $\frac{1}{2}$; thence S. $27^{\circ} E.$ fifty (50) feet along rear line of lot No. eight; to an iron pin on the rear line of the N. E. corner of lot No. four $\frac{1}{2}$, thence along line of last mentioned lot S. $67^{\circ} 30'$ E. one hundred (100) feet to an iron pin on Greene Avenue, thence along said Avenue $\frac{1}{2}$ N. $27^{\circ} E.$ fifty (50) feet to the beginning corner.

This is a part of a three and one-half ($3\frac{1}{2}$) acre tract lying between Anderson Street and Greene Avenue, near the old gun factory, about one (1) mile from the Court House, covered by Susan Beattie to Augustus L. Rose and William Beattie, by deed dated January 14, 1857, and recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds Conveyances for said County and State in deed book "A", page 360.

Thereafter, the said Augustus L. Rose died (seized and possessed of an undivided one-half interest in said three and one-half acre tract), leaving in full force his last will and testament, dated August 1st, 1876, admitted to Probate Court for said County and State, on September 1, 1876 and now on file in the office of said Court in Apartment 39, at file 36 said will being recorded in Will book "B", at pages 253 and 254; whereby he appointed his wife, Mrs. Edith A. Rose, as Executrix, and Thomas L. Locketon as Executor of said will, and authorized them, at their discretion, to sell all or any part of his real estate and to make good titles thereto. Letters testamentary were issued accordingly on September 1, 1876, to said Executor, who conveyed said undivided one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) interest to Mrs. Edith A. Rose, by deed dated December 17, 1888, and recorded in said office in deed book "U", at page 703; and the said Edith A. Rose conveyed the said undivided one-half interest to me by deed dated May 17, 1902, and recorded in said office in deed book "III", at page 279.

The said William Beattie died intestate on August 16, 1882, seized and possessed of the other undivided one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) interest in said three and one-half ($3\frac{1}{2}$) acre tract, and leaving as his sole heirs at law and distributees, his widow, Mrs. Fannie P. Beattie and his two children, Willie E. Beattie and myself, said Perry Beattie. The said Fannie P. Beattie and Willie E. Beattie conveyed all their interest in the said three and one-half acre tract to me by deed dated April 12, 1902, and recorded in said office in deed book "III", page 279.

Said land was surveyed by W. A. Hudson and several lots were sold and conveyed by me. The Hudson plat has been lost or mislaid, and the portion of said land still belonging to me has been surveyed by W. A. Benzeliz, as aforesaid.

TOGETHER with, all and singular, the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining.
TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular, the said premises before mentioned, unto the said, William Beattie,

heirs and assigns, forever.

AND Perry Beattie do hereby bind
heirs, executors and administrators, to warrant and forever defend, all and singular, the said premises unto the said, William Beattie.

Perry Beattie do hereby bind
heirs and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same, or any part thereof,
